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The Law Enforcement Committee of the Gulf of Mexico Fishery
Management Council convened at the IP Casino and Hotel, Biloxi,
Mississippi, Wednesday morning, October 19, 2016, and was called
to order by Chairman Doug Boyd.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA APPROVAL OF MINUTES

9 CHAIRMAN DOUG BOYD: I am calling together the Law Enforcement 10 Committee of the Gulf Council. I am going to read the members 11 from our new list. Doug Boyd, Chair, and that's me. Then Lieutenant Commander Leo Danaher as Vice Chairman. 12 Chris 13 Dale Blankenship is a member, Pam Dana, Diaz, and Dave 14 Donaldson.

We have the agenda before us. It's Tab L-1. Are there any changes or additions to the agenda at this point, committee members? All right. Can I have a motion to accept the agenda? We have a motion and a second, and the agenda is accepted.

21 The minutes are at Tab L-2. Are there any comments or any 22 corrections to the minutes? Not all of this committee was here at the last time, but I will accept any changes from current 23 committee members who see something in there that is wrong. 24 All 25 right. Do we have a motion to accept the minutes? It's been 26 moved and seconded. Thank you. The next thing on the agenda is 27 the Action Guide and Next Steps, Tab L-3, and Steven Atran. 28

ACTION GUIDE AND NEXT STEPS

31 MR. STEVEN ATRAN: There is really two things on here. First of all, the Law Enforcement Technical Committee and the Gulf States 32 33 Commission's Law Enforcement Committee, which is almost the same 34 thing, have been making some revisions to their law enforcement 35 operations plan and strategic plan. Steve VanderKooy is here, 36 and he's going to go over those revisions. Since they do 37 include the Gulf Council, the Gulf Council needs to approve 38 those revisions or suggest any additional changes that you may 39 want, and so that's the first item.

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41 The second item that's on the agenda is a summary of the Law 42 Enforcement Technical Committee meeting report. However, almost 43 everything that's in the report has already been gone over 44 during the Reef Fish Committee or the Coral Committee or is 45 about to be gone over with the strategic and operations plans. 46 I will just have a couple of minor administrative items that I 47 want to bring up when we get to that action. 48

CHAIRMAN BOYD: All right. 1 Thank you, Steve. Next on the 2 agenda is Review and Approval of the Gulf of Mexico Cooperative 3 Law Enforcement Operations and Strategic Plans. Steve 4 VanderKooy is here from the Gulf States Marine Fisheries 5 Commission. 6 7 REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF GULF OF MEXICO COOPERATIVE LAW 8 ENFORCEMENT OPERATIONS AND STRATEGIC PLANS 9 10 MR. STEVE VANDERKOOY: This is in the briefing material that you This is under Tab L. It's 4(a) and 4(b). 11 were sent. I will just give you a guick overview at about the thousand-foot level. 12 13 The LEC and LETC really just needed to clean up a few of the 14 objectives to achieve the now seven goals which were laid out in 15 the four-year strategic plan, which is 4(b) in your briefing 16 book. 17 18 Most of it was a lot of clarification in the language and a little catching up on the items and objectives that may have 19 20 changed during the update from the last operations plan. The primary change was the addition of Goal 7, related to disaster 21 22 response, which was in the previous operations plan, and the new 23 goal was as follows. Goal 7 is the five states will work together for short-term response and long-term recovery from 24 25 manmade and natural disasters. 26 27 In 4(a), the updated operations plan, which is a two-year plan, 28 again, most of those changes were to clean up the language to 29 match the strategic plan and provide more clarification in the 30 tasks that may have been accomplished already, are still 31 ongoing, not yet been implemented, or are new, based on current 32 needs. There are a few tasks that, looking at it now, didn't 33 really fall into the most appropriate objectives, and so they are reorganized into other objectives. 34 35 In that document, the operations plan, Objective 3.4 was 36 37 inadvertently left out of the last operations plan revision, and 38 so they added it back in as all new tasks related to coordinated enforcement efforts. 39 40 41 Two new tasks were added under Objective 5.2, regarding the 42 integrity of domestic fisheries products to address illegal, 43 unreported, and unregulated, or IUU, fishing in the U.S. and 44 from U.S. waters. 45 Finally, under the tasks of Goal 7, which was, again, added 46 since the last operations plan, it was listed as continuing, as 47 the LEC and LETC are sharing post-disaster reports with their 48

1 partner agencies to encourage improvements in future disaster 2 responses. 3 4 It was a little bit of a painful process to update these two 5 documents via conference calls, but there just wasn't enough substantive changes to warrant a face-to-face meeting, although 6 7 it was offered, both by the council and the commission. We will 8 revise the operations plan again in the summer of 2018, to get 9 us through another two years, until the strategic plan needs revision again in 2020. If you want any details, I've got a 10 11 red-line copy that I can go through of where things moved, but 12 that's essentially the major changes. 13 14 Any questions for Steve? CHAIRMAN BOYD: As we all know, the 15 cooperation between state law enforcement and Coast Guard law 16 enforcement is extremely important. It's where the rubber meets 17 the road in accountability, and we need to support and encourage 18 catching the bad guys and giving them obstacles to doing what 19 they do, at almost any cost, and I want to thank law enforcement 20 for that. Steve, did you want to go over L-4(a) also? 21 22 MR. VANDERKOOY: That actually covered both of those documents. 23 24 CHAIRMAN BOYD: That covered both of them? 25 26 MR. VANDERKOOY: Yes, sir. 27 28 CHAIRMAN BOYD: All right. Anything else, Steve? 29 30 VANDERKOOY: Other than I guess, at the committee's MR. preference, if you want to have some sort of a motion to accept 31 32 those or make any further additions, we can make those, but we 33 would like to get those approved, if possible. 34 35 CHAIRMAN BOYD: All right. I would entertain a motion for 36 acceptance of these documents. Chris. 37 38 CHRIS BLANKENSHIP: MR. I move that the law enforcement 39 operations plan and strategic plan be accepted. 40 41 CHAIRMAN BOYD: All right. I have a motion and a second. The 42 motion is coming up on the board. We have a motion that has 43 been made and seconded to approve the law enforcement strategic 44 plan --45 46 MR. BLANKENSHIP: It's to approve the law enforcement operations 47 plan and the strategic plan. 48

1 CHAIRMAN BOYD: All right. Let me read it again. To approve 2 the law enforcement operations plan and strategic plan. Is 3 there any opposition to this motion? Hearing none, the motion 4 is approved. Thank you, Steve.

6 MR. VANDERKOOY: My pleasure.

8 **CHAIRMAN BOYD:** Mr. Atran said a minute ago that we had already 9 pretty much gone through the Law Enforcement Technical Committee 10 report when we did committee reports, but, Steve, did you have 11 something else that you wanted to go over?

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SUMMARY OF LAW ENFORCEMENT TECHNICAL COMMITTEE

15 MR. ATRAN: Just a couple of administrative items that didn't 16 make it into the other overviews. Right now, the Law 17 Enforcement Committee for the Gulf States Commission and the Law 18 Enforcement Technical Committee for the Gulf Council always meet 19 jointly, or nearly always meet jointly. 20

21 It's the same group, with the exception that the Coast Guard 22 representative serves on the commission's Law Enforcement 23 Committee. He is not a member of our LETC, since he is a 24 council member. Other than that, the two committees are 25 identical.

27 They have been electing separate chairs and vice chairs, and so, 28 each time they meet, we have two chairmen and we have two vice 29 There was some discussion of maybe merging them chairman. 30 together and just having a single chair and a since vice chair 31 for the combined group, for efficiency and less confusion, and 32 so that will be taken up, I believe, the next time we have 33 elections. In the meantime, I guess staff was directed to make 34 sure that there were no policy or legal ramifications involved 35 in making that merger.

The other thing that I wanted to mention is that the LETC was reminded that we need to get candidates for the next Officer of the Year Award. They indicated that each of the agencies would submit a candidate by December 1. If that's the case, that would not need to go back to the LETC. It would come directly to the council.

44 Depending upon the timing and how much we have on the agenda, 45 you could evaluate who you wish to give the 2016 Officer of the 46 Year Award to in either the January council meeting or the April 47 council meeting. That is all I have to say that wasn't already 48 covered.

2 CHAIRMAN BOYD: All right. Commander. 3 LCDR LEO DANAHER: Thank you. I just wanted to ask, are we 4 allowed to submit any Coast Guard law enforcement members as 5 nominees for that award? 6 7 8 MR. ATRAN: Yes. In addition to the state agencies, each of the 9 federal agencies can submit one, and so the Coast Guard can 10 Actually, since we have two Coast Guard submit somebody. 11 jurisdictions, I suppose each jurisdiction could submit somebody, if they wished, and NOAA Enforcement could submit 12 13 somebody, if they so desire. 14 15 CHAIRMAN BOYD: Dale. 16 17 MR. DALE DIAZ: Steve, just a quick question. As far as -- I think it's a good idea to have one chair and one vice chair, by 18 19 the way, if there is nothing that stops us from doing that 20 legally. Are the chairs and vice chairs just elected, or do they rotate through each state over time and pick from those 21 22 states? 23 24 MR. ATRAN: No, they are elected. I believe we hold elections 25 every two years, and anyone who is a member of the committee can be elected. There is no succession from Vice Chair to Chair or 26 27 any sort of rotation. 28 29 CHAIRMAN BOYD: All right. I didn't have any other business, 30 but I would like to recognize Lieutenant Colonel Rusty Pittman. 31 He is Chief of Parole for -- Not Parole. Chief of Patrol for 32 Mississippi, and he wanted to say a few words. 33 34 OTHER BUSINESS 35 36 MR. RUSTY PITTMAN: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I don't mind that. 37 It's a lot better than them calling on me in the commission meeting, and when, I step up there, they always say, would you 38 39 please stand up when you're talking to us, Rusty? I'm used to 40 that. 41 42 I am Rusty Pittman. I'm Assistant Chief of Marine Patrol with 43 the Mississippi Department of Marine Resources. One thing I 44 wanted to address is what Dale was asking. We are elected every This past meeting last week, Scott Bannon was 45 two years. elected Chair of the LETC, and Grant Burton was elected Vice 46 Chair of the LETC. I was elected Chair of the LEC, and Chad 47 48 Ebert was elected Vice Chair of the LEC, and so every two years

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1 we do that, and we're going to discuss about combining those and 2 just having one chair and one vice chair for both committees. 3 4 The main reason I came up was to thank Steve VanderKooy for a 5 great job he did, and I don't know he put up with us through all of this with the operations plan and the strategic plan, and 6 also to Steven Atran for his good advice during the whole time. 7 We had a hard time getting together. We kept putting dates off, 8 9 but we finally got together and passed it, and so I really would like to thank both of those guys. Thank you, Mr. Chair. 10 That's 11 all. 12 CHAIRMAN BOYD: Thank you, Rusty. Any other comments or 13 questions for the committee?
