117 responses gathered from April 14 – May 19, 2023






Respondents







Self-identified with sector. Not limited to a singular response (n=127) Number of responses received in each of 21 areas in the Gulf. Respondents could select more than one area so the total number illustrated in the map (n=181) exceeds the number of individual responses.

Overall Comment Sentiment




Overall Sentiment by Sector

Each comment (n=117) was linked to one or more areas based on the self-reported locations (n=181)


Stock Condition Related Response Sentiment

Sentiment of Comments Related to Stock Condition




Number of comments indicating positive, negative, or neutral sentiment regarding stock condition (n=95) Number of responses related to stock condition sorted by fishing sector. Sector was self-selected by each respondent. Respondents were not limited to a singular sector declaration in their responses (n=101). Comments that were not associated with the three primary fishing sectors were not analyzed.

Stock Condition Related Response Sentiment



Each comment related to stock condition (n=101) was linked to one or more areas based on the self-reported locations (n=148)

Automated Analysis



Themes: Manual Analysis

Positive:

- The population is healthy
- Spanish mackerel are large and abundant

<u>Neutral</u>

- There is a change in the migration patterns
- Current management measures are appropriate

<u>Negative</u>

- The population is in decline
- Shark depredation, commercial netting, porgy fishermen, and overharvest by commercial and recreational anglers is causing problems.
