During its October 2022 meeting, the Gulf of Mexico (Gulf) Fishery Management Council (Council) requested an update to the Gulf Ecosystem Status Report based water quality and stock status concerns. However, with the many ongoing regional ecosystem efforts, the workload of Southeast Fisheries Science Center (SEFSC) staff resources, and given that the 2017 Ecosystem Status Report could help inform the Council's Fishery Ecosystem Plan (FEP), we propose having SEFSC staff give a presentation at the next Ecosystem Technical Committee meeting in early 2023.

The Council is currently developing a FEP with the advice of its Ecosystem Technical Committee. This technical committee can identify ecosystem indicators within the status report that can be updated and perhaps synthesized at a finer scale. These indicators could then serve as examples for the development of the Fishery Ecosystem Issues identification and prioritization process that will inform the Council's management decisions. We anticipate these efforts will help focus requests for the SEFSC on future iterations of the Ecosystem Status Report. The Ecosystem Technical Committee's recommendations will be reported back to the Council for feedback and next steps. We appreciate your assistance with this and future efforts in the Gulf.
