


2023 Red Snapper Season Highlights

- Private and state-licensed charter vessel season opened for four-day weekends (Fridays – Mondays) on Friday, May 26th
- Season temporarily closed Sept. 4th and reopened for two-day weekends (Saturdays and Sundays) Sept. 29th – Oct. 2nd and four-day weekends Oct. 6th - 16th
- 16" TL minimum size and 2-fish per person per day creel limit
- Final harvest estimate is 596,083 lbs which exceeded the allocation by 4,098 lbs




Snapper Check harvest estimates during state management, 2018-2023



- Fishing seasons consisted primarily of 3 or 4-day weekends (Fridays Sundays or Fridays Mondays)
- Harvest includes landed fish and fish released dead
- Calibration of Snapper Check estimates to Federal MRIP estimates began in 2023

Mean weight of Red Snapper by mode fished during state management, 2018-2023.



Mean lengths of Red Snapper by mode fished during State Management, 2018-2023.





2024 Recreational Season:

- Season will open Friday, May 24th
- Landing of Red Snapper by private and state-licensed charter vessels is allowed Fridays – Mondays until allocation is met
- Weekdays during the week of Independence Day (Mon-Thurs) will also be open
- 16" TL minimum size and 2-fish per person per day creel limit
- Allocation will be 591,185 lbs (increased to 664,552 lbs pending approval of 2023 Council Framework Action)
