## Status of Gulf States' Survey Calibration update

Gulf of Mexico Fishery Management Council Meeting Biloxi, October 2022



## Council Motion (June 2022):

"to have the [Scientific and Statistical Committee] review state private recreational red snapper calibration ratios using more recent state survey data and provide a recommendation to the Council on change(s) to ratios, if necessary, prior to the January 2023 Council meeting."

 Updating calibrations developed in 2021 discussed at August 2022 meeting between NOAA and State Directors



- SERO worked with S&T to develop two sets of estimates:
  - All years: 2015-2021 for FES and CHTS in numbers of fish and pounds
- Coastal Household Telephone Survey (CHTS) ended in 2017 -CHTS estimates for 2018 to present represent modeled estimates based on the CHTS-FES Calibration model
  - Variation of the process using 2018-2021 data would be to use modeled CHTS for all states
- Estimates provided are annual (inclusive of all waves)
  - States would need to justify selection of waves if not all waves are used to calibrate
- Minimal contribution to estimation from 2018-2019 data used for the imputation process for 2020 estimates
- Independent consultants recommended consistency in methods used as practicable at 2020 workshop

- Approaches used to develop calibrations for the proposed rule varied by State, data availability and survey implementation status
  - Years used varied from 2015-2017 to 2018-2019
- Two basic approaches were used to account for differences in how catch advice was aligned with methods used to monitor:
  - Ratio of state survey landings to MRIP Coastal Household Telephone Survey (CHTS) landings
  - Ratio of MRIP Fishing Effort Survey (FES) landings to CHTS landings divided by the ratio of MRIP FES landings to state survey landings.
- Two more years of data have become available since the initial development of calibrations and proposed rule (2020, 2021)



- NOAA Fisheries (SERO, SEFSC and OST) will work with State partners on information needs related to calibration over the next few weeks while states develop updated calibrated estimates
- States are expected to produce a report detailing methods if calibrated estimates differ from those used to develop calibrations for the proposed rule
- States are requested to provide updated estimates and a report by November 30 to myself (Richard Cody) or Ryan Rindone for the SSC for review and discuss at the Jan 10-12, 2023 SSC Meeting
- The SSC will provide their recommendations to the Council at the January 30 - February 2, 2023 Meeting
