Amendment 56 to the Fishery Management Plan for the Reef Fish Resources of the Gulf of Mexico

Draft Regulatory Text

For the reasons set out in the preamble, NMFS proposes to amend 50 CFR part 622 as follows:

PART 622--FISHERIES OF THE CARIBBEAN, GULF OF MEXICO, AND SOUTH ATLANTIC

1. The authority citation for part 622 continues to read as follows:

Authority: 16 U.S.C. 1801 et seq.

2. In § 622.34, revise paragraph (e) to read as follows:

\S 622.34 Seasonal and area closures designed to protect Gulf reef fish.

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(e) Seasonal closure of the recreational sector for gag. The recreational harvest of gag in or from the Gulf EEZ is closed from January 1 through August 31. During the closure, the bag and possession limits for gag harvested in or from the Gulf EEZ are zero.

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3. In § 622.39, revise paragraph (a)(1)(iii)(B) to

§ 622.41 Annual catch limits (ACLs), annual catch targets (ACTs), and accountability measures (AMs).

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(d) Gag--(1) Commercial sector. See Table 1 for the commercial ACLs in gutted weight. The commercial ACT for gag is equal to the applicable commercial quota specified in § 622.39(a)(1)(iii)(B). The IFQ program for groupers and tilefishes in the Gulf of Mexico serves as the accountability measure for the commercial harvest of gag.

(ii) If the NMFS SRD estimates that gag recreational landings have reached or are projected to reach the applicable recreational ACT specified in paragraph (d) (2) (i) of this section, the AA will file a notification with the Office of the Federal Register to close the recreational sector for the remainder of the fishing year.

On and after the effective date of such a notification, the bag and possession limits of gag in or from the Gulf EEZ are zero. These bag and possession limits apply in the Gulf on board a vessel for which a valid Federal charter

(iii) In addition to the measures specified in paragraph (d) (2) (ii) of this section, if the NMFS SRD estimates that gag recreational landings have exceeded the applicable ACL specified in paragraph (d) (2) (i) of this section and gag is overfished based on the most recent status of U.S. Fisheries Report to Congress, the following measure will apply. The AA will file a notification with the Office of the Federal Register, at or near the beginning of the following fishing year, to reduce the ACL for that following year by the amount of the ACL overage in the prior fishing year, unless the best scientific information available determines that a greater, lesser, or no overage adjustment is necessary.
