






2022 Gulf SEFHIER Data: Total Logbooks, by Month






2022 Gulf SEFHIER: % Compliant vs Non-Compliant Gulf Vessels (With Regard to the Reporting Requirements)







% of Non-Compliant Vessels, by Month (Out of ~1300 Total Gulf Permitted)






2022 Gulf SEFHIER: Late Reporting (No Logbook Submitted Within 30 days of Trip End)




2022 Gulf SEFHIER: Comparison of Gulf to South Atlantic Compliance, with Regard to the Reporting Requirements




2022 Gulf SEFHIER: Compliance with the VMS Requirement




2022 Gulf SEFHIER: Completed Validation Survey Intercepts




2022 Gulf SEFHIER: Approved Landing Locations

Heat map of SEFHIER trips (5 min. resolution).





2022 Gulf SEFHIER: Key Takeaways

2022 = Overall, Gulf SEFHIER program compliance was reasonably goo

- >100k trip reports received
- >91% of vessels were compliant each month
- > 83% of logbooks submitted within 24 hours of trip ending
- <5% of logbooks submitted >30 days of trip ending
- > 84% of vessels were VMS compliant (by the end of 2022)



Without VMS, a comprehensive trip validation program is needed determine non- or mis-reporting vessels
