
Steering Committee Roles and Responsibilities

What is the Recreational Initiative?

An effort to engage recreational anglers and associated industry members to review and evaluate past and current management strategies and explore potential innovative management strategies that could be applied in the future. Lessons and recommendations resulting from this exercise should inform future Council recreational management measures.



Components of the Recreational Initiative



What is the Steering Committee?

A core group of individuals that will work closely with the consultant to direct work on the recreational initiative through the Working Group and through coordination with the Council and agency staff.



Steering Committee Scope of Work

- Select and guide Consultant
- Develop WG agendas and objectives
- Review and synthesize WG outputs
- Determine when outcomes and deliverables are ready for Council review
- Work with Consultant to develop stakeholder engagement plan
- Coordinate work on non-workgroup products



Proposed make-up of Steering Committee

No more than 6 members:

- 2 NOAA Fisheries Staff
 - SE Regional or National Recreational Fisheries Policy Coordinator
 - Regional or Assistant Regional Administrator
- 1 GSMFC Staff Member
- 2 Recreational Council Members
- 1 Council Executive Director

1.5 – 3 days each




Other Steering Committee Work
