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The Law Enforcement Committee of the Gulf of Mexico Fishery Management Council convened at The Battle House Renaissance in Mobile, Alabama on Monday morning, June 5, 2023, and was called to order by Chairman Joe Spraggins.

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ADOPTION OF AGENDA APPROVAL OF MINUTES ACTION GUIDE AND NEXT STEPS

CHAIRMAN JOE SPRAGGINS: Thank you, Mr. Chairman, and I would like to call the Law Enforcement Committee to order and for adoption of the agenda, and the committee members are myself and Mr. Dyskow as Vice Chair, Bannon/Anson, Ms. Boggs, Broussard, Diaz, Donaldson, Dugas, Nadeau, Riechers/Geeslin, and then Shipp. I would like to have a motion for adoption of the agenda for today.

UNIDENTIFIED: So moved.

CHAIRMAN SPRAGGINS: We have a second. Any discussion? All in favor. All right. Approval of the minutes for 2022, could I get a motion for that?

UNIDENTIFIED: So moved.

CHAIRMAN SPRAGGINS: And a second. Any discussion? All in favor. All right. With that, I will turn it to Dr. Froeschke.

LETC SUMMARY FROM OCTOBER 2022 MEETING

DR. JOHN FROESCHKE: I have just a couple of things here, and we have the Law Enforcement Technical Committee Meeting summary, and I will go over a couple of things from that, and that's an informational update only, and then we have Other Business, and that should be a fairly quick update, on the summary that I will focus on with the recommendations, and, if you're okay, will just move directly into that.

Okay, and so the Joint Law Enforcement Committee/Law Enforcement Technical Committee met on March 15, and the purpose of that was to review and rank some of the Law Enforcement Officer of the Year information, and they had a couple of recommendations relevant to the Gulf Council, and so I will just highlight those.

One of those was referring to the commercial trip limit for gray triggerfish that was recently taken for final action by the

council, and they passed, by consensus, that the LETC feels that trip limits set in numbers of fish are more enforceable than a maximum weight, and so that refers to the commercial trip limits, and there was some discussion about whether it should be in pounds or numbers of fish for small trip limits, and, if you recall, we've also had these similar discussions for commercial greater amberjack, and so that might be of some value there as well.

The other recommendation that they had was in regard to closed seasons, and they provided a recommendation for recreational gag that the in-season closures are more difficult for officers to enforce than the fixed closed season. They had a few other things relevant to the Law Enforcement Committee, but not necessarily directly relevant to the council, and so those are the recommendations for this body, and I will stop there for guestions.

CHAIRMAN SPRAGGINS: Okay. Are there any questions? Yes, sir, Mr. Dyskow.

MR. PHIL DYSKOW: Thank you, General Spraggins. Dr. Froeschke, could you repeat what you said about the law enforcement people having difficulty with the enforcement of the gag grouper closure?

DR. FROESCHKE: Well, the gist of the recommendation is that a fixed season, meaning that, as part of it, that the season will open on Date X and close on Date Y, is preferable to something where they open it and then the season is just closed when the ACT is met, or projected to be met, in this case.

MR. DYSKOW: As a follow-up to that, was there any discussion about difficulty, or perceived difficulty, for enforcement if the black grouper season was different from the gag grouper season?

38 DR. FROESCHKE: I was not on the meeting, unfortunately, and so 39 I don't know. I can circle back and find out.

MR. DYSKOW: Thank you.

CHAIRMAN SPRAGGINS: Any other questions? All right. Is there any Other Business? Go ahead, Ms. Boggs.

46 MS. SUSAN BOGGS: I have a question for Dr. Froeschke, and I 47 should know the answer, and I don't, and so I do apologize, and

so the commercial trip limit for the amberjack -- Currently, it's in weight, and so is this something that this council would have to amend, as far as how it's looked at for the commercial fishermen, or is that just something that enforcement would have to do internally?

DR. FROESCHKE: Well, the reason I brought that up is there's a framework action that you will be reviewing at this meeting that has options to consider either the current -- So it's currently a thousand-pound trip limit, with a 250-pound step-down, and some of the options that we've looked at in there, because of the reductions that are going to be in place when Amendment 54 is put in, is it's going to be a big cut to the commercial ACL and the recreational, and so there are options in there for a seven-fish trip limit, and then a five-fish, and the average weight, I believe, is about twenty-six pounds, something like that, and so you could -- There approximate numerical estimates in there as well.

MS. BOGGS: Thank you for the reminder.

CHAIRMAN SPRAGGINS: Okay. Any other questions? Is there any other business for the Law Enforcement Committee? If not, I would just like to take a moment to thank each and every one of them, of our law enforcement, and I know, this last weekend, couple of weekends, and the Memorial weekend, and I'm sure there's a lot of them that worked very hard, and I know ours did, and I appreciate every one of them for what they're doing, and, with that, Mr. Chairman, I will turn it back over to you.

(Whereupon, the meeting adjourned on June 5, 2023.)

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
