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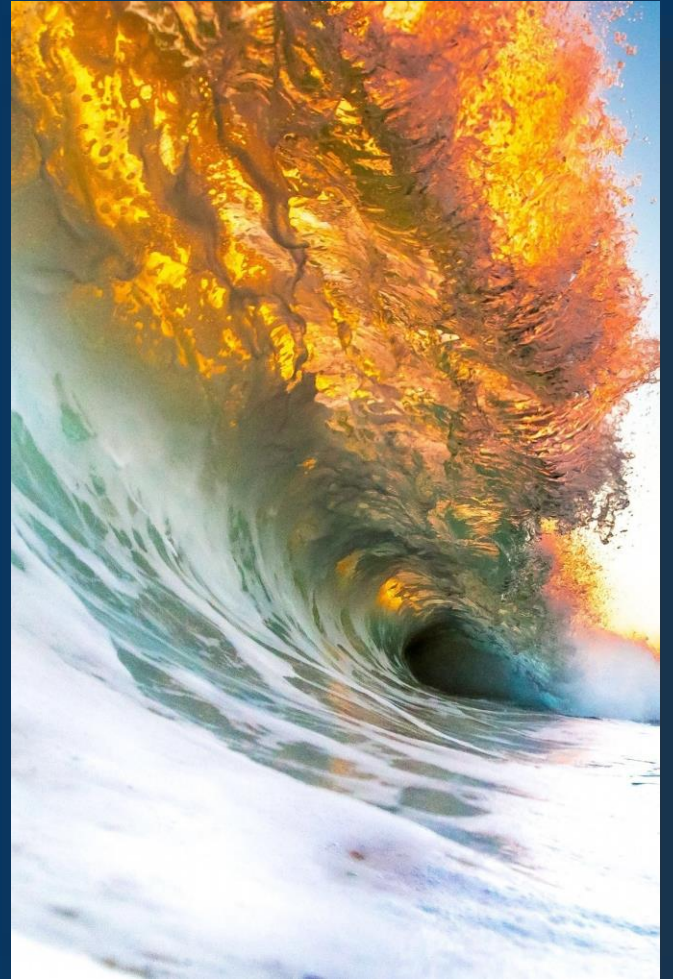
# SEFHIER Background Information



- Federal for-hire electronic reporting began in Jan. 2021
- Applicable permits
  - Charter/headboat Reef Fish
  - Charter/headboat Coastal Migratory Pelagic Fish
  - For-hire historical captain permits

# Anticipated Benefits

- ❖ Census-based reporting
- ❖ Increased accuracy of data
- ❖ Reduction in recall bias
- ❖ Near real-time preliminary data





# Gulf Timeline

- Initially developed in conjunction with South Atlantic (2013)
  - Same logbook fields across regions, same database to receive data
- Separated amendments (2014)
  - Gulf added built-in validation components (2014)
  - Declaration, VMS positioning, and validation survey
- Final rule to implement the program published (2020)
  - Reporting requirement effective separate from VMS positioning
- Logbook and declarations effective (January 2021)
- Validation survey (to start ~September/October 2021)
- VMS position reporting will begin mid-December 2021



# Program Goals

- Produce reliable estimates of catch and effort for federally permitted for-hire vessels
- Immediate data uses
  - Validate minimum catch & effort estimates
- Future data uses
  - Requires independent dockside survey (in progress)
  - Requires calibration and benchmarking to existing data collections



# Reporting Requirements

Approved software applications work on a variety of platforms (iOS, android, computer)

## Declaration

- Submitted prior to leaving a dock for *any* trip
- Trip activity determines whether additional information is required
- Fishing Trips:
  - Estimated return time
  - Estimated return location
  - Must land only at approved landing location
  - Landing location is selected in declaration

## Logbook

- Submitted prior to fish offload
- Trip information – vessel, captain, trip date, etc.
- Catch data – all species landed and discarded
- Effort data – anglers, hours fished, gear, depth, target species, etc.
- Economic data – amount of fuel used & cost, charter fee
- *Southeast Regional Headboat Survey (SRHS) vessels only report using VESL's SRHS form*

## VMS requirement

- Begins Dec 13, 2021
- Cellular and satellite VMS units approved for use
- Some units contain reporting forms
- Some units work with Reef Fish Permits
- Power-down exemptions
  - Min. 72 hr off
  - Vessel can not move on water for any reason
- Equipment failure exception
  - On-going Council action

  - Cost = free
  - Also compliant with GARFO, HMS
- VESL by Bluefin Data LLC
  - Webpage, iOS, Android
  - Cost = free
  - Also compliant with SRHS, SC
- Upcoming new vendor

# Data Collection

- Currently: Vendor → ACCSP, ACCSP → NMFS database
  - ACCSP's data collection meets reporting requirements of all east coast NMFS reporting requirements (e.g., GARFO and HMS)
  - Referred to as One-Stop Reporting (OSR)
- Upcoming: Alternative reporting pathway for SERO only vessels
  - Build data collection pathway (in progress)
  - Modify database for new pathways (in progress)
  - Update vendor requirements to meet each pathway
- Data collection pathways under modification related to stakeholder feedback





# Validation Survey

- For-hire Methods Workshop (2019) recommends robust Complemented Census and Sampling Survey design
  - Mandatory logbook census with dockside survey
  - Estimates final landings using capture/recapture statistical method to account for unreported or misreported catch and effort
    - Capture = Logbook; Recapture = dockside survey
- Survey designed in collaboration with Office of Science & Technology
- Validation survey through GulfFIN and state partners
  - Brief survey on vessel catch/effort; includes biological sampling
  - Permit holders required to answer survey questions
- Calibration & benchmark to existing data collections
  - Vessels still need to report to MRIP



# Data Usability

- Requires effective enforcement and compliance
- Logbooks are monitored for outlier values
- Declarations
  - Characterizes effort and may indicate pending logbooks
- Positioning
  - Replaces boots on the ground to ground-truths trips taken
  - May indicate pending logbooks
- Survey
  - Used to calculate final landings
  - Accounts for misreporting and/or under-reporting
- Equipment failure options weighed in relation to validation of data

# Gulf & South Atlantic Permit Accounts

- 1,647 permit holders have yet to register with approved vendor
  - +41 Accounts (37 eTrips accounts) added since Aug. 1st
  - August 27th = 2,288 registered accounts
  - Accounts include both permit holders & captains (not 1:1)
- Expect 20-30% permit latency
- Some surrendered permits due to increased restrictions (\*S. Atl.)
- SERO and Council staff enhancing outreach efforts to improve industry understanding of For-Hire regulations
- SERO anticipates increased participation as permits come up for renewal

# VMS Update

## cVMS (cellular-based VMS) Type Approvals for Gulf For-Hire

1. Faria ETERM-C cVMS approved
  2. CLS NEMO cVMS approved
  3. Nautic Alert cVMS is currently undergoing sea trials for approval
- ❖ VMS rule to publish in Sept, with an effective date of Dec 13<sup>th</sup>

# Declaration Discussion

- Per the regulations, a declaration is required every time a vessel leaves the dock (e.g. getting gas, ice, bait, home stop)
  - Must select appropriate trip activity on the declaration (e.g. trip no intention of fishing)
- Some vessels that were reporting consistently have now stopped reporting
- Some logbooks are missing a declaration
  - SEFHIER staff attempt to reach out to constituents to remind them of their permit requirements





# General Discussion Items

- Dually permitted vessels (Commercial Reef Fish & For-Hire):
  - Must complete both a commercial reef fish and for-hire trip declaration when going on a for-hire trip
  - NMFS is investigating how to streamline for these dually permitted vessels
  - These notifications serve different purposes for each sector, and have different regulatory text
- HMS caught species:
  - Using VESL app: still need to complete the HMS electronic logbook report
  - Using eTrips/mobile app: prompts for HMS required questions

# 1

Select a reporting software; select & install a VMS unit before the effective date

# 2

Create a reporting account for each vessel/user

Review the website; watch informational videos, read SEFHIER toolkits

Check that your landing location is approved. If not, submit a landing location request form for approval
